


Hello, my name is Abbie and I am 10 years old. I live in Petts Wood in England and I have read an information about your village, Kaimari. Consequently I have written this letter.

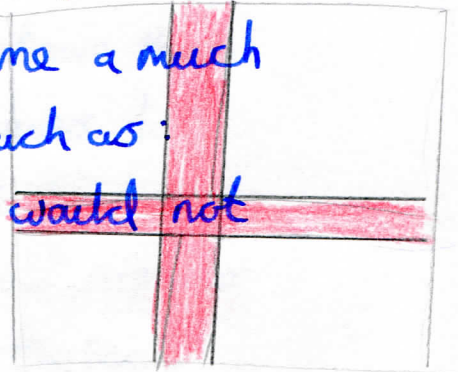

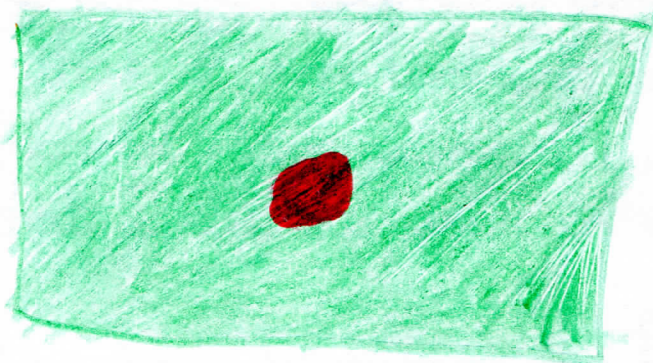
